

# ASH 2022 abstracts: What's hot in AML?

To help navigate the exciting content being presented at the 64th ASH Annual Meeting & Exposition, the AML Hub Steering Committee members have provided their recommendations for the top abstracts to look out for in AML, in 5 categories: Novel therapeutic agents; practicechanging abstracts; biomarkers and molecular profiling; induction and consolidation regimens; and MRD assessment and utility.
